**EXAMINATION FEE:** A fee of \$20.00 is required for each separately numbered examination for which you apply. The required fee **MUST** accompany your application and be in our office by 4:30pm on the last filing date or you will not be approved to take the examination. Send or deliver your certified check or money order payable to the Delaware County Personnel Office. Write the examination number(s) on your check or money order. **\*\*\*\*PERSONAL CHECKS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.\*\*\*\*** No refund of fees will be allowed whether or not you meet the minimum qualifications. You are urged to compare your qualifications carefully with the requirements for admission and file only for those examinations for which you are clearly qualified.

**EXAMINATION FEE WAIVER:** A waiver of examination fee will be allowed if you are unemployed and primarily responsible for the support of a household. In addition, a waiver of examination fee will be allowed if you are determined eligible for Medicaid, or receiving Supplemental Security Income payments, or Public Assistance (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families/Family Assistance or Safety Net Assistance) or are certified Job Training Partnership Act/Workforce Investment Act eligible through a State or local social service agency. **All claims for examination fee waiver are subject to verification. If you can verify eligibility for examination fee waiver, complete a "Request for Examination Fee Waiver and Certification" form and submit it with your application by the Last Filing Date as listed on the Examination Announcement. **LOCATION OF POSITION:** Delaware County Sheriff's Department, Delhi, N.Y.

**SALARY:** \$54,827 - \$61,195

**DUTIES:** The work involves responsibility for all activities of an assigned division. Incumbents are normally given a primary assignment to supervise all the activities of a specific division, i.e. road patrol, communications, investigation or civil but may be required to work in and supervise personnel in any or all divisions and may on occasion work in and supervise personnel in corrections. An incumbent in this class serves as a uniformed supervisor of all activities in an assigned area or division. The work is performed under the general supervision of a higher ranking officer with leeway allowed for the exercising of independent judgment within the limits of departmental policy. This position differs from that of Deputy Sheriff Sergeant by the virtue of increased supervisory responsibility and independent judgment needed to do the work. Supervision is exercised over various personnel in an assigned division. Does related work as required.

**REQUIREMENTS TO TAKE THIS EXAMINATION:** Candidates for this examination must have 36 months of **permanent status** immediately preceding the date of the written test as a Senior Investigator in the Delaware County Sheriffs Department AND;  
A. (1) Graduation from a regionally accredited or New York State registered two year college with an Associate's degree in Criminal Justice, Police Science or related field, or Sixty credit hours from a regionally accredited or New York State registered college with at least fifteen credit hours in the behavioral sciences\*and two years as a Police Sergeant or Deputy Sheriff Sergeant or four years experience as a Police Officer or Deputy Sheriff; Or  
B. (1) Graduation from high school or possession of a high school equivalency diploma, and (2) two years of investigative experience or two years of active military service\*\* and two years as a Police Sergeant or a Deputy Sheriff Sergeant or four years experience as a Police Officer or Deputy Sheriff; Or  
C. (1) Graduation from high school or possession of a high school equivalency diploma, and (2) certified by Municipal Police Training and registered with Division of Criminal Justice Services and two years as a Police Sergeant or a Deputy Sheriff Sergeant or four years experience as a Police Officer or Deputy Sheriff; Or  
D. An equivalent combination of training and experience as indicated in (A), (B)and (C) above.

**NOTE:** \*Behavioral Sciences are limited to psychology, sociology and anthropology.

\*\* Military duty is defines as the Army, Navy, marine Corps, Air Force, Coast Guard and the national Guard when in service for the United States. Such service must have been on a full-time active duty basis other than for training purposes. Proof of an honorable discharge (DD-214) must be provided.

**SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS FOR ACCEPTANCE OF APPLICATIONS:**

1. In order to be eligible for appointment, candidate must meet current requirements of Section 58 of the Civil Service Law.
2. Must be eligible for a driver's license issued by the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles and must possess same at the time of appointment and maintain during employment.
3. Incumbents in this position must abide to policies and procedures of the Delaware County Sheriff's Office.

**NOTE:** Unless otherwise specified, all required experience must be full-time paid or its part-time paid equivalent. **You are responsible for submitting an accurate, adequate and clear description of your experience. Omissions or vagueness will NOT be interpreted in your favor.** Applicants for examination must meet all minimum qualifications on or before the examination date with no tolerances allowed. If an applicant lacks the required experience or has not completed all required training at the time he/she submits an application, but is serving in a qualifying position or will complete all required course work by the date of the examination, he/she may be approved conditionally to take an examination pending verification of successful completion of all experience and training requirements.

**NOTE:** **Rating of seniority** is based on the length of continuous permanent classified service in the jurisdiction, with points added to an Eligible's passing score for each appropriate five year period or fraction thereof in accordance with the following schedule: Less than 1 year..0 points; 1 year up to 6 years..1 point; Over 6 years up to 11 years..2 points; Over 11 years up to 16 years..3 points; Etc.

**Scopes / Subjects of examination:** A test designed to evaluate knowledge, skills and /or abilities in the following areas.

**Law enforcement methods and practices:** These questions test for knowledge of accepted police methods and practices and/or their application to situations in the police field. The questions are a sampling of the various knowledge that police personnel may be required to possess in the course of their day-to-day work-related activities.

**P. E. R. C. Statement:** The final rating key for this examination will be established by the State Civil Service Commission prior to the testing date, upon recommendation of a committee of police experts who will review all the questions for appropriateness and accuracy. There will be no review of the questions by candidates. The committee was selected with the assistance and endorsement of the Police Conference of New York, Inc., the NYS Association of PBAs, Inc., the NYS Association of Chiefs of Police, Inc., and the NYS Sheriff's Association.

**New York State Laws - Police:** These questions test for knowledge of the laws in effect on January 1, 2019 that law enforcement personnel may encounter in the course of their day-to-day work-related activities. The questions are a sampling of job-related sections of the Penal Law, Criminal Procedure Law, Vehicle and Traffic Law, Family Court Act and other laws relevant to law enforcement in New York State.

**Preparing written material in a police setting:** These questions test for the ability to prepare the types of reports that police officers write. You will be presented with a page of notes followed by several questions. Each question will consist of four restatements of the information given in the notes. From each set of four, you must choose the version that presents the information most clearly and accurately.

**Understanding and interpreting written material:** These questions test how well you comprehend written material. You will be provided with brief reading selections and will be asked questions about the selections. All the information required to answer the questions will be presented in the selections; you will not be required to have any special knowledge relating to the subject areas of the selections.

**Planning, supervising and administering police programs and activities :** These questions test for knowledge of the principles and practices involved in managing an organizational segment of a police department in New York State and directing the activities of subordinate staff, including subordinate supervisors. These questions cover such areas as planning, controlling, directing, organizing, and coordinating the activities of the organizational section. Questions also cover the personal interactions between an upper-level supervisor and subordinate supervisors in the accomplishment of objectives and deal with issues of work assignments, job performance, and training.

**NOTICE TO CANDIDATES: THE USE OF CALCULATORS IS PROHIBITED FOR THIS EXAM.**

**This examination is announced and will be rated in accordance with Section 23-2 of the Civil Service Law. The provisions of the New York State Civil Service Law, Rules and Regulations dealing with the rating of examinations will apply to this examination.**

Applications for examination can be obtained from the Delaware County Personnel Office, 1 Courthouse Square Suite #2, Delhi, New York 13753. **ALL RELEVANT INFORMATION MUST BE CONTAINED IN YOUR APPLICATION. RESUMES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED AS A SUBSTITUTE FOR YOUR APPLICATION BUT WILL BE ACCEPTED only AS AN ADDITION TO YOUR APPLICATION.** A separate application must be filed for EACH examination for which you apply. Applications must contain the correct examination title and/or number in order to be considered. The Delaware County Personnel Office reserves the right to accept or to reject applications/fees submitted/postmarked after the last announced filing date. The Delaware County Personnel Office is NOT responsible for the delivery, from this office by the postal system, of exam announcements or other material relating to the exam.

**APPLICATION DEADLINE POLICY:** All applications along with application fees or proofs of waiver must be submitted to the Delaware County Personnel Office by 4:30pm on the date of last file as listed on the Examination announcement. Applications received via U.S. Mail will be accepted only if received on or before the last file date. Applications that are received after the Application Deadline and are not received in the Personnel Office by the last file date will not be accepted.

If you are unable to take this examination due to an emergency situation, and you wish an alternate test date, you MUST call the Delaware County Personnel Office, with your request, by noon of the Monday following the test date.

**\*\*\*Religious Accommodation\*\*\***Most written tests are held on Saturdays. If you cannot take the test on the announced test date due to a conflict with religious observance or practice, check the box under "Special Arrangements." We will make arrangements for you to take the test on a different date (usually the following Monday).

**\*\*\*Handicapped Persons:\*\*\***If special arrangements for testing are required, please indicate this on your application.

**\*\*\*Active Duty Military Personnel:\*\*\***Pursuant to Section 243b of the Military Law, applicants who are unable to take this exam on the regular exam date because of active military duty may be eligible to take a special military makeup examination. If you are on active military duty and unable to take this exam on the regularly scheduled exam date, please indicate this on your application. You will then be sent additional information regarding a military makeup exam.

**\*\*\*Veterans or Disabled Veterans:\*\*\*** Who are eligible for additional credit must submit an application for veteran's credit with their application for examination or at any time between the dates of their application for examination and the date of the establishment of the resulting eligible list. Applications for veteran's credit are available from this office. Veteran's credits can only be added to a passing score. Effective January 1, 1998, the State Constitution was amended to permit a candidate **currently in the armed forces** to apply for and be conditionally granted veteran's credit in examinations. Any candidate who applies for such credit must provide proof of military status to receive the conditional credit. **No credit may be granted after the establishment of the list.** It's the responsibility of the candidate to provide appropriate proof indicating the service was in time of war, as defined in Section 85 of the Civil Service Law, and that the candidate received an honorable discharge or was released under honorable conditions in order to be certified at a score including veteran's credits.

**\*\*\*Children of Firefighters and Police Officers Killed in the Line of Duty\*\*\***In conformance with section 85-a of the Civil Service Law, children of firefighters and police officers killed in the line of duty shall be entitled to receive an additional ten points in a competitive examination for original appointment in the same municipality in which his or her parent has served. If you are qualified to participate in this examination and are a child of a firefighter or police officer killed in the line of duty in this municipality, please inform this office of this matter when you submit your application for examination. A candidate claiming such credit has a minimum of two months from the application deadline to provide the necessary documentation to verify additional credit eligibility. However, no credit may be added after the eligible list has been established.
