## PRESS RELEASE

Two Deposit men have been arrested by the Delaware County Sheriff's Office on multiple felony drug sale charges following a six month long investigation conducted in the Village of Deposit by members of the Delaware County Sheriff's Office Criminal Investigation Division. Both men were indicted by a Delaware County Grand Jury and arrested on Arrest Warrants issued late Thursday afternoon by the Delaware County Court.


On Thursday afternoon, Clint L. Stevens, 29, of Deposit, was arrested by Delaware County Sheriff's Investigators on a Sealed Indictment Warrant charging him with three class B felony offenses of Criminal Sale of a Controlled Substance in the Third Degree.



Stevens was arrested on the Sealed Indictment Warrant shortly after being arrested earlier that afternoon as a result of a sting operation conducted by members of the Delaware County Sheriff's Office Criminal Investigation Division and Broome County Special Investigation Unit Task Force. Following that sting operation, Stevens was charged with one class B felony offense of Criminal Sale of a Controlled Substance in the Third Degree and two class B felony counts of Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance in the Third Degree for selling and possessing quantities of heroin and cocaine with the intent to sell.

The Grand Jury Indictment accuses Stevens of selling heroin in the Village of Deposit (*Delaware County*) on three different occasions during the month of July, 2015.

On Friday morning, Delaware County Sheriff's Office arrested 34 year old Todd M. Perrington, of Deposit, on a Sealed Indictment Warrant charging him with three class B felony offenses of Criminal Sale of a Controlled Substance in the Third Degree. Perrington was arrested at the Broome County Correctional Facility where he was being held, without bail, on charges of Criminal Sale of a Controlled Substance in the Third Degree and Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance in the Seventh Degree relating to the sale of heroin in the Village of Deposit and the execution of a search warrant at his Village of Deposit (*Broome County*) residence on Wednesday afternoon by members of the Broome County Special Investigation Unit Task Force and Delaware County Sheriff's Office.



The Grand Jury Indictment accuses Perrington of selling heroin in the Village of Deposit (*Delaware County*) on three different occasions during the months of March and April, 2015. Stevens and Perrington were arraigned on the Indictment Warrants in Delaware County Court on Friday afternoon and were both remanded to the Delaware County Correctional Facility where they are being held without bail pending future court appearances.

The defendants each face potential consecutive sentences of up to nine (9) years imprisonment for each class B felony drug offense they may be convicted of.

The Delaware County Sheriff's Office and Broome County Task Force credit the public for providing tips identifying these individuals as narcotics traffickers and taking the initiative to keep their communities safe and drug free. The Delaware County Sheriff's Office continues to urge the public to call their Toll Free Tip Hotline at (1-888-914-9111) or to submit tips to the Sheriff's Office via its Mobile Patrol App.

Undersheriff Craig DuMond remarked "Sheriff Mills and I are extremely proud of the courageous and dedicated work of our Narcotics Investigators and Deputies...our Office shall remain relentless toward ridding our communities of these dealers. We will continue to forge partnerships with all agencies and utilizes all available resources in our tireless pursuit in this endeavor".

The Broome County Special Investigation Unit Task Force is comprised of members of the Broome County Sheriff's Office, the City of Binghamton Police Department, the Village of Endicott Police Department and the Village of Johnson City Police Department.
