PRESS RELEASE

On Thursday afternoon following a five month long drug trafficking investigation conducted in the Sidney area by members of the Delaware County Sheriff's Office Criminal Investigation Division and Village of Sidney Police Department, four area residents were arrested and charged as felony-level drug dealers.

Arrested on Sealed Grand Jury Indictment Warrants issued earlier that day were:



Lewis C. "Sonny" Wolcott, Jr., 37, of Grand Street, Sidney.

Wolcott has been charged with three counts of **Criminal Sale of a Controlled Substance in the Third Degree**, a class B felony. Wolcott is accused of selling cocaine in the Village of Sidney during November and December, 2014.

Wolcott was arraigned on the Sealed Indictment in Delaware County Court on Friday afternoon and was remanded to the Delaware County Correctional Facility without bail pending continuation of his arraignment at a later date.

If convicted of these charges, Wolcott faces potential consecutive sentences of two to twelve years on each charge as a second felony drug offender. In 2009 he was convicted in Delaware County Court of Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance in the Fifth Degree, a class D felony.



Stacey D. Sullivan, Jr., 35, of St. Hwy. 206, Masonville.

Sullivan has been charged with one count of **Criminal Sale of a Controlled Substance in the Third Degree**, a class B felony, and one count of **Criminal Sale of a Controlled Substance in or near School Grounds**, also a class B felony. Sullivan is accused of selling Heroin in the Village of Sidney during February, 2015.

Sullivan was arraigned on the Sealed Indictment in Delaware County Court on Friday afternoon and was remanded to the Delaware County Correctional Facility without bail pending continuation of her arraignment at a later date.

If convicted of these charges, Sullivan faces a potential sentence of two to twelve years as a second felony drug offender. In 2014 Sullivan was convicted in Broome County Court of Attempted Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance in the Third Degree, a class C felony, and is currently on Probation as a result of that conviction.



Douglas J. Wilkinson, 34, of Grand Street, Sidney, and Smyrna, NY.

Wilkinson has been charged with one count of **Criminal Sale of a Controlled Substance in the Third Degree**, a class B felony, and two counts of **Criminal Sale of a Controlled Substance in**



the Fourth Degree, which is a class C felony. Wilkinson is accused of selling Oxycodone and Hydrocodone in the Village of Sidney during January of this year.

Wilkinson was arraigned on the Sealed Indictment in Delaware County Court on Friday afternoon and was remanded to the Delaware County Correctional Facility without bail pending continuation of his arraignment at a later date.

If convicted of these charges as a second felony offender, Wilkinson faces potential consecutive sentences of two to twelve years on the charge of Criminal Sale of a Controlled Substance in the Third Degree and one and one-half to eight years on each Criminal Sale of a Controlled Substance in the Fourth Degree charge. In 2010 Wilkinson was convicted in Chenango County Court of Burglary in the Third Degree, a class D felony.



Amanda M. Caffery, 34, of Grand Street, Sidney.

Caffery has been charged with one count of **Criminal Sale of a Controlled Substance in the Fourth Degree**, a class C felony. Sullivan is accused of selling Hydrocodone in the Village of Sidney during January, 2015.

Caffery was arraigned on the Sealed Indictment in Delaware County Court on Friday afternoon and was remanded to the Delaware County Correctional Facility without bail pending continuation of her arraignment at a later date.

If convicted of these charges, Caffrey faces a potential sentence of one to five and one-half years imprisonment.

All Sidney arrests were made with the assistance of the Sidney Police Dept and NY State Police.

Following an unrelated investigation in the Stamford, NY area by members of the Delaware County Sheriff's Criminal Investigation Division, Deputies also arrested a 19 year old Stamford resident Thursday afternoon.

Deputies arrested 19 year old **Christopher A. Whitely, Jr.**, of Prospect St., Stamford, on a Sealed Grand Jury Indictment Warrant charging him with three counts of **Criminal Sale of a Controlled Substance in the Third Degree**, a class B felony. Whitely is accused of selling cocaine in the Village of Stamford during October and November 2014.



Whitely was arraigned on the Sealed Indictment in Delaware County Court on Thursday afternoon and was remanded to the Delaware County Correctional Facility in lieu of \$10,000 cash bail pending continuation of his arraignment at a later date.

If found guilty of these charges Whitely faces potential consecutive sentences of one to nine years imprisonment for each charge.

Upon executing the warrant, Whitely was also arrested and charged with Unlawful Possession of Marihuana, a violation, after being found to have a quantity of marihuana in a backpack he possessed at the time of his arrest. Whitely was issued an appearance ticket returnable in the Town of Harpersfield Court on June 15th.

Undersheriff Craig DuMond remarked, "Sheriff Mills, Chief Hood and I are very proud of the teamwork and culminated efforts of our Investigators and Officers...their solid teamwork and relentless efforts are making a difference in our communities.
